ORDINANCE 26

STATUTES, ORDINANCES AND REGULATIONS

1. The functions of the Board of Trustees set out in the Statutes include:

Statute 10 (extract)

10.1.12 to make or amend Statutes and Ordinances;

PROCEDURE FOR MAKING STATUTES

- 2. Any proposal to amend the Statutes will be considered firstly by the Board of Trustees.
- 3. If the Board of Trustees is minded to accept the proposal then Clauses 3 and 4 of the University of London Act 1994, hereinafter referred to as 'the Act', set out the procedure which must be followed to amend the Statutes.

ORDINANCES

4. Ordinances may be made, ratified, amended or revoked at any meeting of the Board of Trustees providing that notice and details of the proposal were included in the agenda and that the views of the Collegiate Council have been sought as appropriate on any proposal which, in the opinion of the Board of Trustees, is relevant to it.

PROCEDURE FOR MAKING ACADEMIC REGULATIONS

5. Academic Regulations may be made, ratified, amended or revoked at any meeting of the Collegiate Council providing that notice and details of the proposal were included in the agenda.

INTERPRETATION

- 6. Ordinances and Regulations shall be interpreted in accordance with the Statutes. If any doubt arises over the interpretation of an Ordinance or a Regulation the matter shall be referred to the Vice-Chancellor who shall determine the matter.
