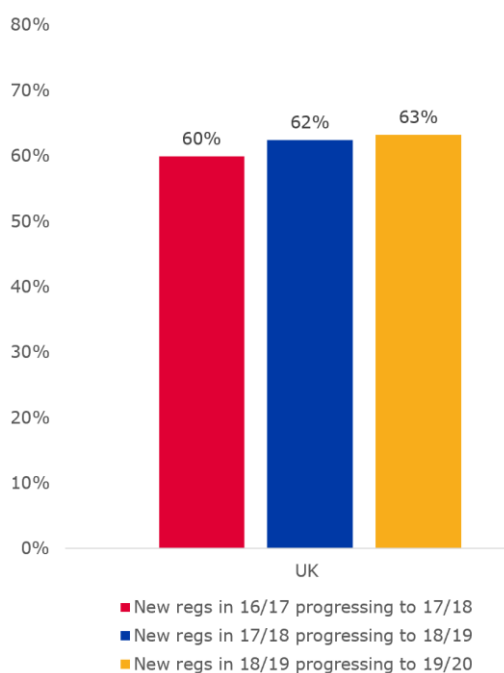
Table 1: University of London, UK Undergraduate part-time students from under-represented groups: Trends for the Academic Year 17/18 – 19/20.

POLAR 1&2 (Lowest HE participation)	14%	8%	21%	13%
IMD 1&2 (Most deprived)	31%	36%	39%	3%
21 and over (Mature)	92%	93%	92%	-1%
Ethnic Minorities (BMEG)	39%	34%	36%	2%
Declared Disability	6%	7%	9%	2%

- In 19/20, there has been an increase in the proportion of students from each under-represented group except for Mature but here the rates remain high and strong.
- The University is 24 percentage points above the sector part-time benchmark for the proportion of BMEG new entrants (36% vs. 11.5%)<sup>1</sup>

- First year continuation rates are showing improvement each academic year.
- Newly launched web-supported programme areas that have a dedicated student support team report high continuation rate.

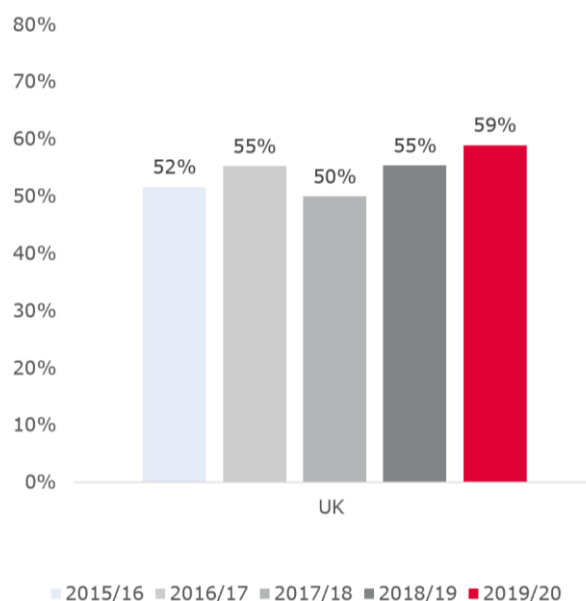
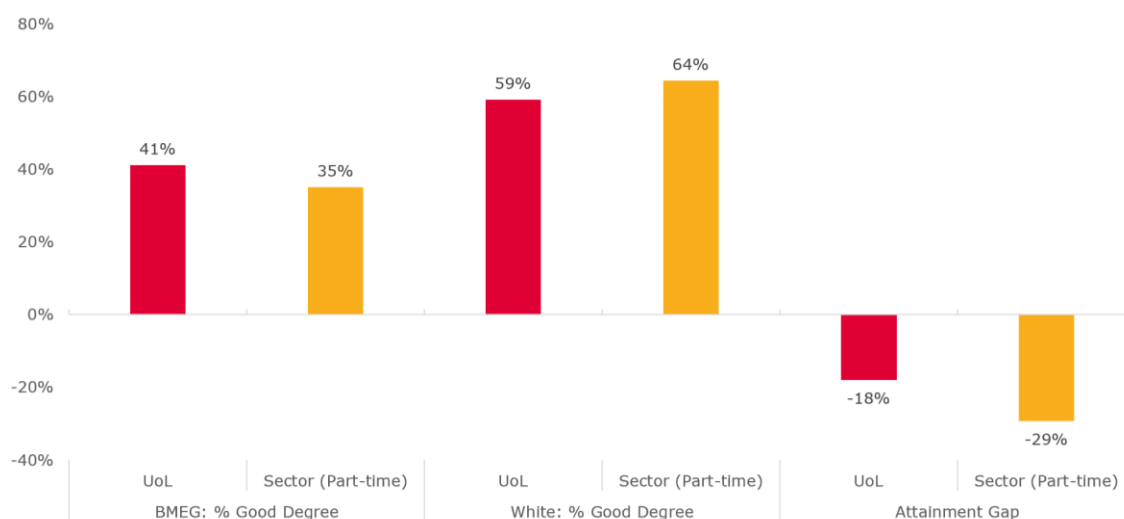


Chart 3: University of London, UK Undergraduate first degree, part-time student attainment gap for 2019/20 vs. sector benchmark (part-time)



- BMEG attainment rates are 6 percentage points higher than the sector benchmark for first degree, part-time students. In addition, the attainment gap at the University of London (18%) is significantly lower than that seen for the sector as a whole (29%<sup>2</sup> for part-time students).
