The Survey

Methodology

The First Destinations Survey for University of London International Programmes was loosely based upon the Destination of Leavers from Higher Education (DLHE) survey which is conducted annually by all HEFCE funded Higher Education institutions.

Targeting graduates approximately six months following graduation, the survey was conducted online between March and August 2016. An initial email containing a web link was sent to all graduates on 25th March 2016, with follow up emails sent out fortnightly. The final reminder email was sent on the 15th July, 1 week before the survey deadline on the 22nd July.

The overall response rate for the survey is **12.3%** accounted for by 908 valid responses. If we discount the response rates for countries with fewer than 5 graduates in the Rest of the World category, then Malawi has the highest proportion of responses with 63%. While Singapore has the highest total number of responses for a single country with 111 they have a relatively low response rate of just 4%.

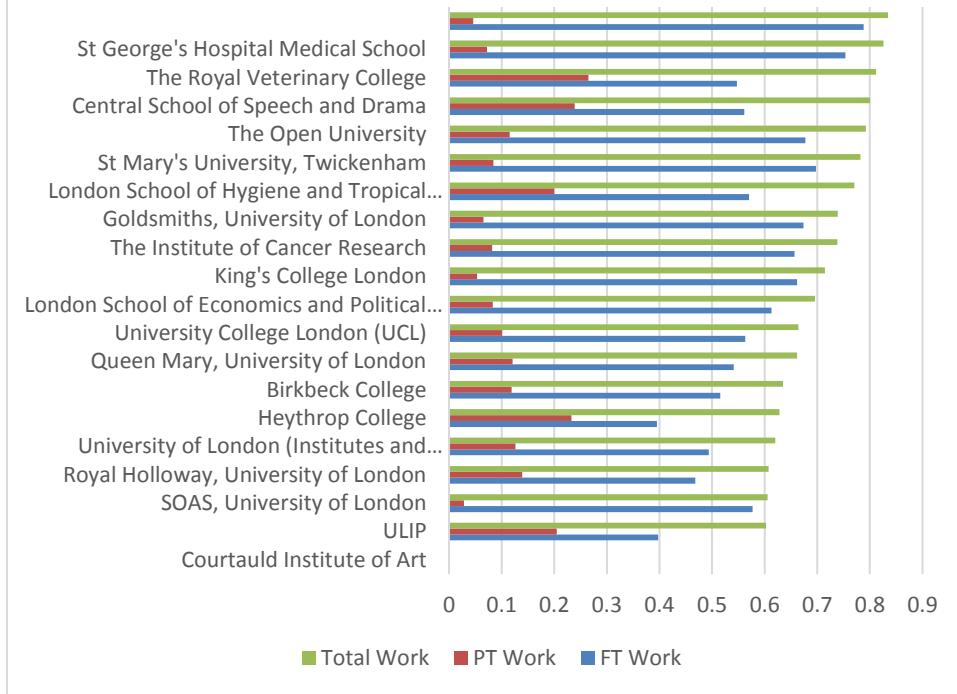

UoLIP is positioned *eighteenth* in this group in terms of graduates progressing to either FT or PT Work (61%) ahead of top universities such the Courtauld Institute of Art. However, this does not demonstrate the full story as most colleges with higher levels of employment tend to be focussed on medicine, education and veterinary science which traditionally have very high levels of employment. An additional factor is the low number of responses received for this survey. Due to this low response rate, a further breakdown such as employment by subject may be statistically misleading.

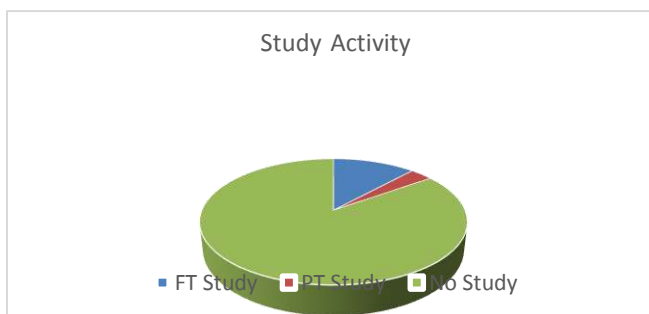
Employment Activity

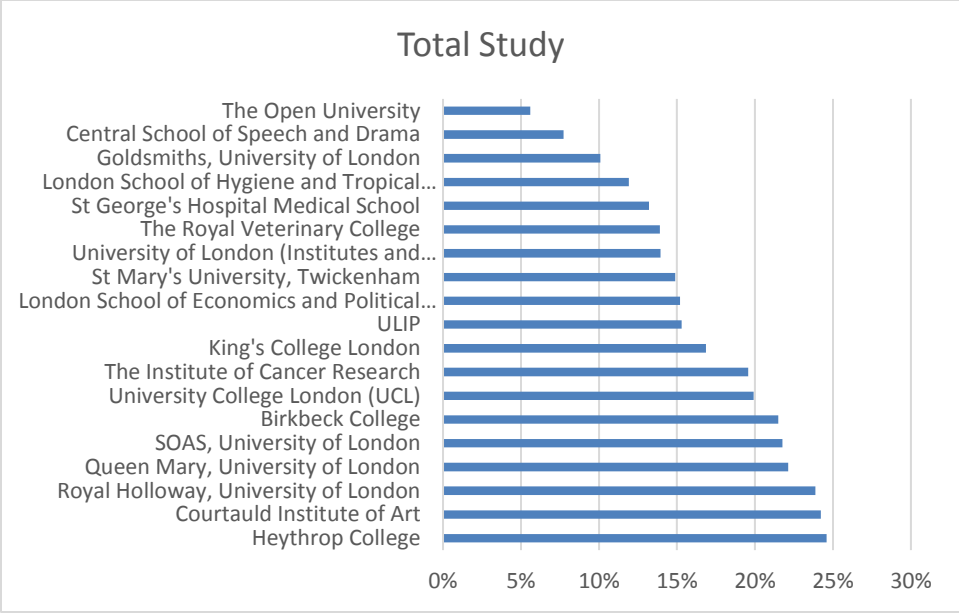

UoLIP is positioned in the centre of the group in terms of graduates progressing to either FT or PT Study (15%) after graduation in this group ahead of top universities such as LSHTM (12%) and the Open University (6%). This is due to a combination of factors factors: many students had a very positive learning experience and have gone on to do further study at UoLIP, undergraduate students have continued to postgraduate courses, and possibly also reflects the view of typical UoLIP students who may value continuous lifelong learning.

The above table shows the type of further qualification sought by Graduates from UoLIP. As we can see, the majority of graduates entering further study take a Higher Degree by Taught Course (34%). We have 5 (3%) Graduates who reported to be studying but did not provide information on the type of qualification they are studying for.

It can be seen from the data that the vast majority (95%) of UoLIP graduates who are employed, are in a Graduate Level job. Caution is advised here, due to the low number of responses. For example, Graduates who are unemployed or working in 'less desirable' jobs are less likely to respond to a survey asking about their current employment situation and so there is an innate bias towards Graduate Level positions, which is may be noticeable due to low responses.

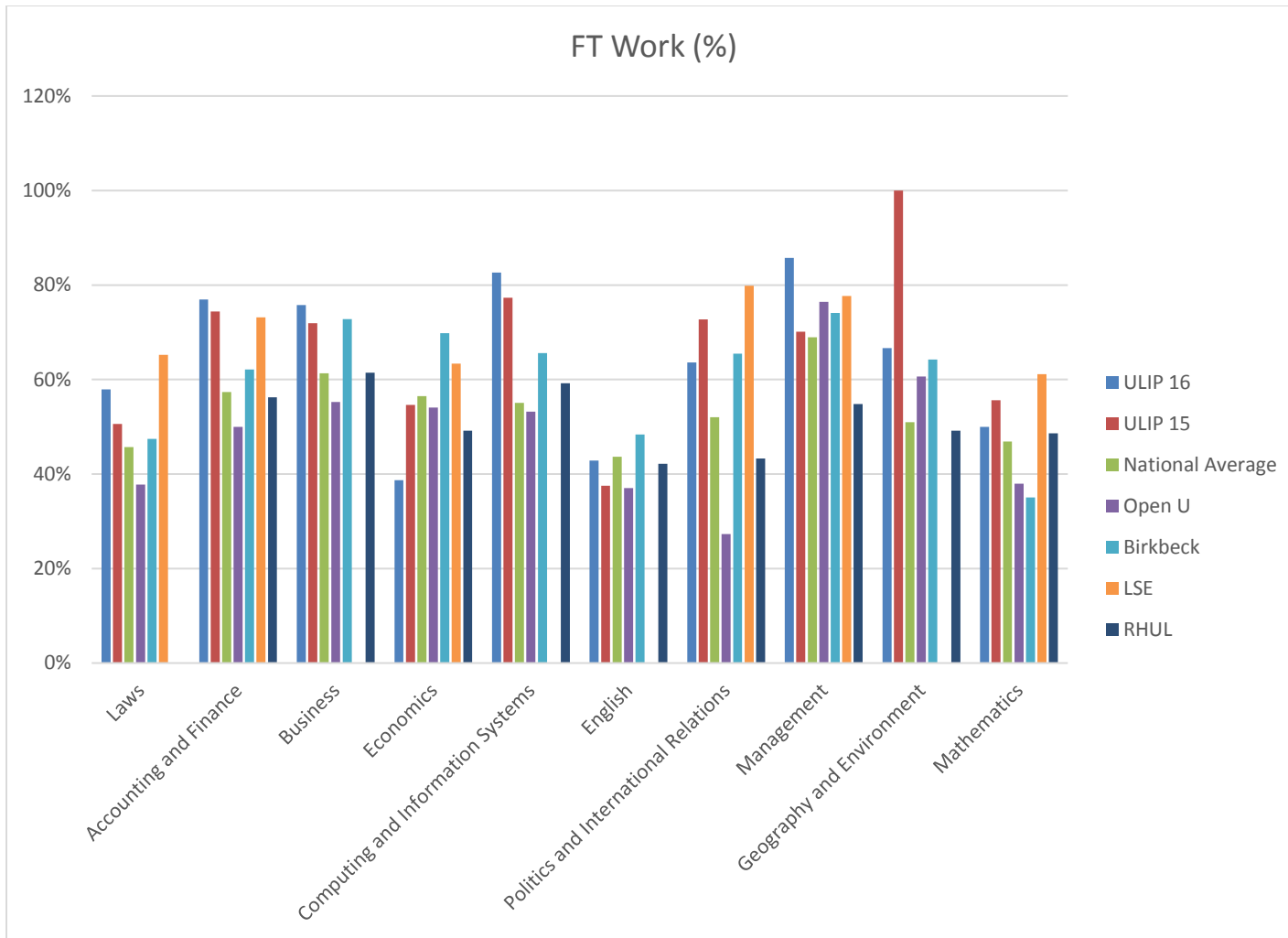
Notes

- Using the 2014/15 DLHE national dataset, comparisons were performed against the UK average, Open University, Birkbeck College, LSE and RHUL. These were then broken into principle subject area (JACS Level 2).
- Each comparison looked at the top 10 occupations, FT Work %, Graduate level work %, and Further study %.
- It is not possible to run industry sector comparisons as HESA were unable to provide reliable SIC data this year.
- Comparison to the figures in the DLHE survey should be treated as a guide only as the DLHE survey results contain UK and EU domiciled students only, and asks slightly different questions.
- Only subjects with 5 or more UoLIP respondents have been included, and caution should be exercised when viewing all results due to the small number of ULIP responses which could skew the data.
- All benchmark data are expressed in Full time equivalent (FTE)

Percentage of leavers in full-time work as a proportion of all leavers

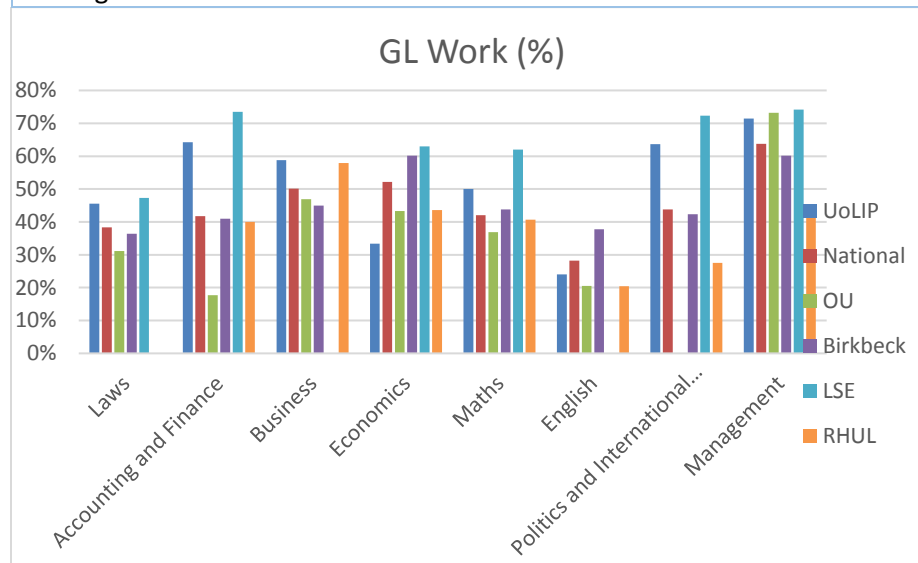

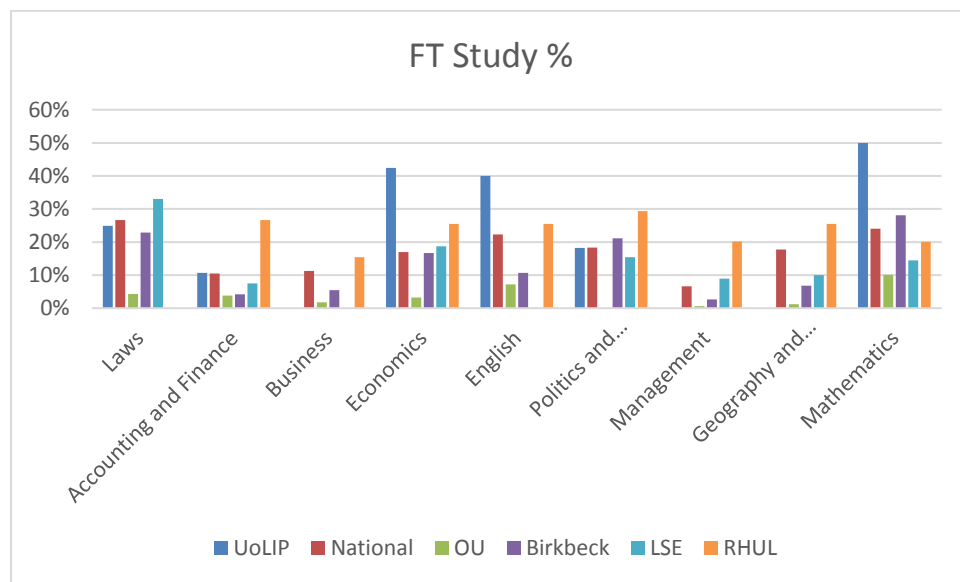
Comparisons by subject of the proportion of graduate level work shows more mixed results, although UoLIP still outperforms the national average in most of the subject categories. The low figure for Accounting & Finance stands out due to the high numbers in book-keeping and payroll which is not classed as Graduate Level. The high performance of Maths also stands out, but caution must be used here as it is based on just two responses.

Percentage of leavers undertaking further study, either full-time or part-time

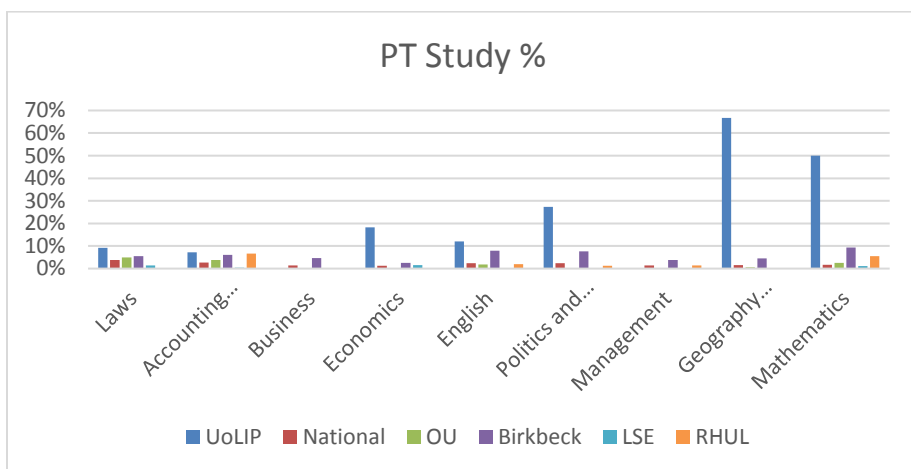
